The Southern Division has worked hard on "Raising Awareness" to put smiling faces on our Special Children. The Southern Division ended the year with 81.37%. Congratulations to de Texas for adding 21 new partners and retaining 107 for 87.07%, de Kentucky for 2 new members and retaining 54 for 70.89%, de Florida 1 new partner and retaining 44 for 81.82%, d' Alabama 1 new partner retaining 38 for 92.86%, d' Arkansas no new partners and retaining 29 for 69.05%. Nationale Chapeau theme carried out capably by partners in the Western Division was: <u>"Raising Awareness"</u> to put a Sunny Smile for our Special Children.

The following is taken from the last contribution spread sheet prepared by Nationale.

**Partnership:** CA and NE each brought in ten new partners.

WA reached 111% of goal, AZ with 105%, ID achieved 103% and NE, SD both had 100%. (That's five Departmentals with 100% or more; OR and SD tied for at goal dates.

WA was rated highest in 8&40 nationally!

NJH: Western Division donated \$3700.55, over half of all nationwide.

**8&40 Foundation:** Western Division donated \$2809.73 over half of all nationally.

CWF: Western Division donated \$3801.72 over half as recorded nationally.

Reporting as of the deadline 7/15/2025. This committee has worked on approving 3 Departemental Constitutions and Bylaws this year. One of them will be completed after the National La Marche. Please use the 8and40.org website Departemental C & B template; it will make your job quick and stress-free. Please note that the Petit C & B template is currently on the 8and40.org website for those of you who have been waiting. Easy-peasy, Get-R-Done! Personal certificates will be given to the Departemental Chairman who dedicates time to completing their Departemental C & B report form for 2024-2025.

Of the 25 Departemental, I received 12 reports. That means this Committee had 48% of Departemental reporting. Less last year. I know we are capable of better than this, let's try harder next year. I'm still happy with those Chairmen who honored their commitment and completed their duties. Thank you.

Of the 25 Departemental reports received, only 10 sent names and addresses to the Nationale, 1 did not, and one was not certain if they had. 11 Reported they have the latest National Constitution and Bylaws on hand and use them. Only 10 Departemental encourage the use of these governing documents. 8 Departemental reviewed their Standing Rules. Of the 8 that reviewed their Standing Rules, 2 Departemental made changes or added new Standing Rules. Even your standing rules may need revisions

occasionally, as some of your practices may have changed. Partners, the goal raise over \$20,000 for 8 scholarships of \$2,000 to each applicant who meets the criteria to receive the scholarship money.

Nationale La Secretaire Sandra received 20 complete applications. Of those, three went to Chapeau Babara's scholarship projects 2024-2025, and 8 were awarded the Salon National scholarship.

Of the 20 applications, seven applicants were not US citizens, which is a requirement. The remaining 2 applications were not good candidates. One wanted to be a dentist. All recipients have been notified, and checks have been mailed to them. Applications were reviewed by Nationale La Secretaire Sandra and two counselors from a local college with nursing programs.
