As the year of Hope for a Cure comes to a close – soon, I want to thank all the Departementaux for the hospitality shown to me as I visited nine Departementaux. It was a great honor to visit and meet so many of our wonderful partners throughout the Nation. I renewed friendships with more partners than I thought I knew. Keep up the great work you all do in your Departmental and Petit Salons.

Here are the results from this past year:

Total partnership goals reported was 2362, while current partners reported was 2076 with 89 petit salons and 128 new partners reported.

74 Salons attended a Department La Marche with 384 partners attending.

There were 12 salons held a leadership program with 211 partners in attendance.

There were 25 petit salons who held initiations with 30 offering mentors to the partners. 12 salons wrote histories and one did a memory book, 5 made prayer books and 3 did communication books.

16 salons reported receiving communications from the National Officers and Chairmen and 5 salons did not. All salons found the information shared very helpful and 2 made the communication book for competition. Many guests were entertained by the salons with many of the partners seeing that the guests were treated royally.

There were 76 clinics or hospitals were recorded and in our Departments. 35 of the 76 were supported in many ways, such as with ditty bags, gifts for the children, and funds for whatever the Clinics or Hospitals needed to help with the patients. Many volunteers gave \$7806 in funds and 225 hours were donated with many more not recorded. There were 34 asthma camps supported in many Departementaux with over \$3100.

There were 613 petit salons who contacted and worked with the Lung and Respiratory Association: with \$4567 in funds, Cystic Fibrosis Association - giving 2190 hours and \$3168 in funds, 15,904 children in total who received aid in one way or another.

Departementaux donated \$ 6,985 to the All Partners Project, Nurses Scholarship received \$7,755, National Jewish Health \$325 and the American Legion Child Welfare Foundation received \$ 6,960 and the American Lung Association \$ over \$1000 in Christmas seals.

20 salons told people around them about the 8 and 40 and nineteen Petit Chapeaux had special Projects. It is just amazing to see of the projects being supported by our great organizations throughout the United States. Please know that there were many more items and funds donated throughout the year just not recorded on the Chapeau Reports.

To all the partners and Petit Salons keep up the great work you are doing and know we will again achieve much in the New Year. Thanks again for all the care and support along with the love shown to me and my riding companions this past year. You have made my year a year to be remembered.

“High Hopes”

It has been a learning experience and a rewarding opportunity to serve as the National Le Demi Chapeau this year. A year of “High Hopes” and great expectations.

Partners did an excellent job of raising money for the American Legion Child Welfare Foundation. This Foundation provides grants to organizations that work with children. This year, the Eight and Forty goal was to raise \$10,000 to \$11,000. Even though we had ‘High Hopes’ of reaching the goal, we were a little short --- Departementaux raised \$9,834.60. In its 66th year, the CWF has awarded \$740,889 in grants to 17 nonprofits that support youth-serving projects that seek to enhance the lives of children by addressing their physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs. Judging these grants was one of my opportunities as Le Demi Chapeau.

These pandemic times have made it more challenging to collect donations for some. Many Salons and Departementaux are just recently returning to in-person meetings, and this will help in the future to work on fund raising activities.

I’m proud to announce that the Departmental of Nebraska received the Gold Heritage Circle Gift Club Benefactor award for raising the most funds this year. Nebraska raised \$2,357, followed by Arizona at \$2,251 and California at \$1,371. The Western Division led the way in donations with \$6809.32, followed by the Southern Division with \$1179.93, the Central Division with \$967.68, and the Eastern Division with \$877.67. Congratulations for all the hard work soliciting funds. Keep up the good work supporting the ALCWF that supports non-profit organizations working with children.

I am proud to think that the smallest Division, with only 6 Departementaux, made approximately 20% of the total donations. And, that doesn't take into account all the donations made to local programs and causes.

Thank you to the Partners in the Central Division for the reports and bulletins received throughout the year, and the courtesies you have extended to me this year. As you attend this Nationale Marche, have fun, make new friends, renew old friendships, and learn more about our wonderful organization! Know you are a treasured Partner of an organization filled with HOPE for a Cure for Our Special Children.

Le Demi Chapeau National - Eastern Division

This has been a wonderful year and started out at the installation in Kentucky. Returning home, I worked on my first bulletin and put together a group database to be able to contact everyone.

Eastern division conference was held in Connecticut in March and was highly successful. We had Partners from Connecticut, Massachusetts, New York, and Pennsylvania. We had a meet and greet Friday night and the conference was on Saturday. A guest speaker from the Cystic Fibrosis foundation told of the history of the disease and the progress that has been made and about the Great Strides Walks around the country. It was a great weekend and I thank all the partners of Connecticut for helping to make it a remarkable success. I sent out four bulletins this year, fall, winter spring and summer to keep our partners informed. I regret to say, after trying extremely hard to contact them that I was never able to contact New Jersey or Maryland and therefore have no reports for them. It was also very unfortunate that we found out that

New Hampshire and Rhode Island had turned in their charters. Good news is that some of the partners from those states have transferred to Massachusetts and Connecticut, so we did not lose them all. I visited Pennsylvania and was scheduled for Massachusetts but was not able to attend. Thank you, Pennsylvania, for your great hospitality.

My personal project this year was the great strides work for cystic fibrosis and I tried to set up walks in all the states. I have not received complete totals yet, but Connecticut donated \$984 for the walk in Manchester and New Haven. I have attached a summary of the state's activities:

Massachusetts- They have two salons and one of them donated \$500 in toys to the Boston asthma clinic. Another donated pediatric Johnny's and toys to the Hasbro hospital. They have been working on their constitution and bylaws to update it and have mentored many partners in the their Departemental and they have made all their usual donations to the national Jewish health and the American Legion child welfare foundation. Many thinking of you and sympathy cards were sent out by the L'Aumonier. They had a small fundraiser and raised \$865 for their projects in the coming year. They were unable to make 100% partnership as many losses occurred through their salons this year. They attended the Eastern conference and Judy Tryba, is their candidate for le Demi Chapeau for Eastern division this year.

New York- They have nine salons and they brought in nine new partners this year. \$1300 to local hospitals and clinics for children with respiratory problems. They have helped eighty children, six families, to help our special children. They sent in \$860 for nurses' scholarship, and \$60 for the American Legion child welfare foundation. They sent in all their donations to the national Jewish Health and the all-partners project. They assisted four hospitals throughout the state for children who have respiratory diseases and one Nicu unit. They attended the eastern division conference in Connecticut

Pennsylvania- They have two salons and have brought in eleven new partners this year. Donations for all the different projects were sent in. The salons raised \$400 for gifts for children at the Allentown Hospital for Easter, Christmas, and Halloween. They donate to three hospitals in Pennsylvania and raised a total of \$5439 which was split with all three. Chapeau Nationale Judy Zimmerman visited their state as well as the Eastern division le Demi Chapeau.

Connecticut- They have five salons and entertained becoming only one next year but decided to remain the same for now. They raised \$984 for the great strides work for cystic fibrosis. They sent in all their donations into Nationale. They raised money to send child to easy breezy camp for asthmatic children but because of Covid it was not held so they are continuing to collect more donations. They have adopted a cystic fibrosis child that partners and Departemental sent cards and gifts to for holidays. They also hosted the Eastern Division Conference. I have enjoyed this position very much and thanks to everyone that helped me to fulfill it. A special shout out to Sharon Evans for showing me the ropes to know what to do.

The Western Division's theme was "Carve a Tunnel of HOPE for our Special Children" and a tunnel it is. We've all stepped up to this beautiful wish or Goal for this year 2021-2022. Our tunnel from the Western Division has been filled with continuing to get new partners for our wonderful organization to take care of our special children. The tunnel for Eight and Forty Foundation has excelled because of your donations totaling \$2,627.00; ALCWF totaled \$6,867.32; American Lung totaled \$3,387.50; The National Jewish Health totaled \$6,236.80; and the Nurses' Scholarship totaled \$11,634.28 with a donation from Western Division of \$335.00. The total from the Western Division was \$31,087.90 – thank you to all the Departementaux – You Are Special and you tunneled right through to the end of the year.

Congratulations to South Dakota partners for coming in 2nd in membership. This year was a nip and tuck between Kentucky and South Dakota where South Dakota lead all the way up until the last 30 days and then Kentucky overcame our membership by about 4%. But it was a close race for all of our divisions this year. The Western Division was 85.65% and South Dakota was at 104% of Goal. Thank you to all the partners for doing their share in getting members to join the Eight and Forty Organization. This is awesome.

This year all the Departementaux were very busy doing fund raisers including a fashion show with many donated items and door prizes; themed baskets for a “Bucket Auction”; raffles, bake sales; Arizona's Chapeau Special project was to supply Camp Not-A-Wheeze with everything on their list of needed items plus a sizable donation; and many other fund raisers were also successful.

This year Western Division salons reported volunteer hours – 952 hours, and I know more hours have been put into many projects and events so it is understated. We have many salons that sponsor and support camps and children through each of their areas and it is greatly appreciated. This year Cystic Fibrosis Association was supported by the Western Division with \$750.00 and many volunteer hours.

I received three history books from the Western Division and the winner was sent on to National.

I just want to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your cooperation throughout the year to get my bulletins passed on to each other and to say a “BIG South Dakota Thank you to each of you for all you do for the Eight and Forty Organization and the Western Division is the Best in MY Eyes. This Chairman received 13 reports. Fundraisers were done by all Salon's and Departementaux, which included Bake-less bake sales, Discovery toy Party, Fashion Shows, Quarter mania's, Basket raffle's, Bunko's, and Passing the Can, along with Monetary donations. Departemental Chapeaux had special projects to help with donations as well.

We were unable to visit National Jewish Health for Chapeau Days again this year due to restrictions of Covid-19. Departementaux, Salons, and Partners still did their part in supporting National Jewish Health with a Total of \$15,364.50. Pediatrics \$3,134.50, Recreational \$3,063.50, Shower of Checks \$315.00, All Partners American Lung Association, this was National Chapeau, Judy's, Special Project \$5,614.50. Ditty Bags 3,237.00, along with Salons making Ditty Bags and sending them to local Children's Hospitals. Direct Aid including Departemental Chapeau's special projects, \$21,414.16. Research \$3,210.00. American Lung Association, Easter and Christmas Seals \$2,200.00. Twenty (20) Children were locally adopted and was given gift cards for Birthdays and Christmas.

A.L.C.W.F. \$6,936.13, Memorials \$570.00, totaling \$7,506.13. Eight and Forty (8 and; 40) Foundation \$3,237.00. With 3,356 voluntary hours, over 2,973 children were assisted with this program as of reports submitted, Fifty-two thousand one hundred seventy-three dollars and seventy-nine cents, (\$52,173.79) has been raised for the Children and Youth Program for 2021-2022 year.

Thank You National Chapeau Judy for allowing me to serve as your 2021-2022 Children and; Youth Chairman. Thank you Departementaux, Salon's, and Partner's for your continuous Work and Dedication, HOPE for finding a cure for our Special Children, with Lung and Respiratory Diseases along with Cystic Fibrosis, Asthma, and Tuberculosis.

As we finally get back into the swing of in-person meetings, we can inform all Partners of the year's accomplishments. This committee has approved no Departementaux Constitution and Bylaws. Copies of the needed corrections were sent back to those Departementaux, and we have one resubmission. Please use the National website template; it will make your job easier. Personal certificates will be given to the Departementaux that dedicated time to completing their Departemental report forms for the 2021-2022 year.

Of the 30 Departementaux, I received 15 reports and wished this number would improve. That means only 50% reporting. Let's not be complacent with keeping up-to-date Constitution and Bylaws. Even your standing rules may need revisions occasionally, as some of your practices may have changed.

One Departemental Constitution and Bylaws is on hold for review, corrections, and approval for 2021-2022. Plenty of time to start working on the C and; B's for this coming year. Departementaux reported that 13 out of 15 sent names and addresses to the Nationale, and two were not positive if they had. 15 Reported they have the latest National Constitution and Bylaws on hand and use it. 15 Departementaux encourage the use of these governing documents. 11 Departementaux reviewed their Standing Rules, and 4 reported they did not. Of the 11 that reviewed their Standing Rules, 4 made changes or added new Standing Rules.

Thank you, Chapeau Judy, for having faith in my abilities to be the Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee and for allowing me to serve with you in your year of "HOPE for a CURE."

Here are the standings as of July 31 st , Western Division \$12,004.28, Central Division \$4,799.30, Southern Division \$3,394.00, and Eastern Division \$2,939.94. We had the total of 29 Departementaux out of 30 turned in monies for the total of \$23,184.52. Funds fell \$815.48 short to pay for all eight, but we have money in the reserved to make up the difference. My hope is that we can do better next year, but during this time of the Covid hanging on you have done a great job.

I received 19 reports this year one from the Western Divisional Chairman, 11 from Departmental Chairman’s, and 8 from Petit Salons Chairmen... Awards will be given out at the Division Luncheon.
